Babies



Babies have been busy exploring, learning, and growing through a variety of engaging and developmentally appropriate activities. Our little ones had a fantastic time learning about colours, Australian animals, and sounds through songs, picture books, puzzles, puppets, and sensory play. We incorporated lots of movement and music into our daily routine.

Sensory learning was a big focus, offering our babies the opportunity to touch, smell, and explore various textures and natural materials. During NAIDOC Week, we introduced the babies to Aboriginal culture through stories, songs, and art using Aboriginal picture cards and natural materials. This was a special time to celebrate and respect the world's oldest continuing cultures.

Toddlers

This month, the toddlers focused on the themes of transport and musical instruments. They joyfully explored toys while continuing to build on their developmental milestones. Their activities included sensory exploration, fine motor skills, language and listening development.



The children also explored sustainable transport and musical toys, developing their gross motor, cognitive, and imaginative thinking skills through play. As part of our commitment to inclusive and culturally respectful learning, they were introduced to Aboriginal musical instruments such as the didgeridoo, as well as various forms of transport.

The children enjoyed listening to musical sounds, engaging in art and craft activities, and laughing along to cheerful rhythms

Kindy 2

Children have been exploring various themes and celebrations this month, including space and Book Week.

For the space theme exploration, the children showed great curiosity and enthusiasm as they learned about space, the solar system, and the changing phases of the moon. They also discovered how Aboriginal people observe the night sky and explored stories connected to Aboriginal astronomy.

The children engaged in a variety of hands-on activities such as creating rocket ships, alien artwork, and imaginative space designs through art and craft. They also participated in games, puzzles, sensory play, book reading, and video watching to deepen their knowledge about planets and astronauts. These experiences supported their development in numeracy and literacy, fine motor and cutting skills, while also fostering creativity, imagination, cognitive growth, and social interaction.

Book Week was another highlight of the month. The children enjoyed book reading and storytelling, listening to classic tales and Dreamtime stories. They also shared their own favourite books from home and were excited to dress up as their favourite book characters. This special week promoted a love for reading while strengthening language skills, imagination, and social connections.



Sustainability



Children have been learning about the importance of reusing and recycling. They are also working collaboratively to care for our vegetable and herb garden, showing respect for nature. In addition, they have been exploring a nature-based sensory basket, engaging with native materials through hands-on experiences.



Kindy 3

Kindy 3 children have explored a range of important learning areas. As part of their Protective Education program, they learned about private body parts, recognise safe and unsafe touches, and identify trusted adults they can turn to for help.

In early literacy, the children focused on identifying letters of the alphabet, while in numeracy, they explored foundational concepts such as measurement (length) and shapes. They also engaged in creative exploration across various learning areas, with activities designed around their interests to extend and deepen their learning.

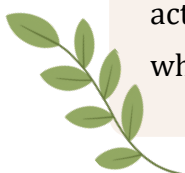
