## Babies

During October, our babies have been busy exploring a variety of engaging learning experiences. They have been developing their fine motor skills through activities such as playing with playdough, stacking blocks, transferring water and manipulating cause-and-effect toys.

Our transportation theme sparked lots of curiosity as the babies explored toy cars, trains, buses and trucks, listened to different transport sounds and matched them with picture cards. We also celebrated Children's Week with joyful group activities. They especially loved the mud incursion!



## Toddlers

Our toddlers had the perfect opportunity to explore the season of spring through a variety of engaging activities. Their natural curiosity shone as they discovered new sounds, textures and sights while joyfully experiencing the beauty of the season. The children enjoyed outdoor exploration, sensory play, music and movement, pretend play and building with blocks.

In addition, our toddlers have been learning how to keep themselves and their friends safe. Through play, stories, songs and hands-on activities, they are beginning to understand important safety concepts in fun and meaningful ways.

## Kindy

October has been a wonderful and busy month in the Kindy room. The children have been deeply engaged in a range of hands-on learning experiences focused on building their number recognition and counting skills. Through playful and meaningful activities, they have been developing confidence, problem-solving abilities and fine motor control.

Throughout the month, the Kindy children participated in number-themed games, sensory play, art and craft and puzzles. These experiences encouraged them to learn ordering numbers, writing numerals and matching numbers to quantities. It was wonderful to see the children developing concentration and enjoying the challenge of each new activity while strengthening their counting and observation skills.

As part of our cultural learning, the children also explored Aboriginal culture by learning to count in the Noongar language, creating dot paintings and playing themed card memory games. In addition, they celebrated the Chinese Mid-Autumn Festival by making lanterns and watching story videos about the legend of the festival. We also learned about the Diwali Festival by making colourful diyas.

For Children's Week, the Kindy group celebrated with a variety of fun and interactive experiences, including spring gardening, sports games, a dance party, a science day and a special muddy play incursion. The children showed great excitement and enthusiasm throughout the week, developing their language, sensory and social skills through rich and joyful play experiences.



## World Pasta Day



Our children had a fantastic time celebrating World Pasta Day by making handmade pasta. The younger children watched with curiosity as educators explained each ingredient and demonstrated the process, eagerly taking turns to mix the dough and see it come together. In Kindy, Ms Skye guided the children through rolling and using the pasta machine. Throughout the activity, they learnt about handwashing, teamwork and the joy of creating something together, a hands-on experience filled with curiosity, laughter and learning.



## Hands-on Learning at Daisy's

At Daisy's, we love giving children opportunities to explore, imagine and learn through hands-on experiences. During October, our play and learning activities were filled with curiosity, creativity and connection as children engaged in a range of sensory experiences.

Through water play, children experimented with floating and sinking objects, scooping and pouring and watching ripples spread. These simple yet joyful moments helped strengthen fine motor skills and encouraged discovery through play.

Our mud pie making was a favourite among many, with little chefs mixing, moulding and "baking" their creations. Using imagination and teamwork, they turned muddy mixtures into cakes, pies and soups, delighting in the textures and laughter that followed.



The washing activity encouraged collaboration and care, as children worked together to clean tools, pour out bowls and lend a helping hand to friends. These moments reflected the kindness and cooperation that are part of everyday life at Daisy's.

To celebrate the season, children also enjoyed planting flowers, feeling the soil between their fingers, touching the petals and helping to pot new plants. These sensory-rich experiences deepened their connection with nature and sparked wonder about how things grow.

From water and mud to soil and teamwork, each hands-on experience nurtured curiosity, creativity and confidence, the heart of learning at Daisy's.
