## Babies

In February, our babies enjoyed meaningful learning experiences focused on wild animals and community helpers. They explored animal toys and picture cards, learned to recognise different animals, and happily imitated their sounds, showing growing curiosity and excitement.

As they learned about their community, the babies explored familiar places like the dentist, doctor, school, library, bakery, post office, farms, transport, and local eateries. Through play and conversation, they began to understand how people help one another in everyday life.

Music and movement experiences brought joy as they explored instruments, made music together, and moved to the rhythm.

We celebrated Lunar New Year through sensory play and art, and introduced simple ways to care for the environment during Australia Clean Up Day. They also enjoyed gardening, feeling soil, watering plants, and observing nature up close.

These experiences supported the babies' emotional and social development, strengthening their sense of belonging, confidence, and joy in learning.

## Toddlers

This month, the toddlers have shown a strong interest in transportation especially trucks, cars, buses, and airplanes. We extended this curiosity into a variety of learning experiences across the curriculum.

Through stories and picture books about transport, the children were encouraged to name different vehicles, imitate their sounds, and engage in discussions. These experiences supported the development of listening skills and expressive language. The toddlers also enjoyed transport-themed nursery rhymes, which helped strengthen their memory, coordination, and confidence.

We further explored through art activities, sensory play, and early maths and literacy experiences, allowing the children to learn through hands-on exploration and creativity.

The children also enthusiastically participated in our Australia Day and Chinese New Year celebrations. They engaged in a variety of hands-on experiences, including art, sensory play, music, and group discussions.

These activities provided meaningful opportunities for the children to explore different cultures, traditions, and celebrations, while developing their social skills and fostering a strong sense of belonging within our learning community.

## Kindy

February has been a busy and exciting month in our Kindy Room! Our focus has been on learning about emotions and celebrating Chinese New Year, with many engaging and meaningful experiences for the children.

Throughout the month, children explored different types of emotions through picture card matching, drawing facial expressions, themed storytelling, songs and board games. These activities supported children in recognising and naming feelings such as happiness, sadness, anger and excitement.

During group discussions, children talked about how people might feel in different situations and shared ideas about strategies to manage emotions. We discussed calming techniques such as deep breathing, asking for help, using words to express feelings and taking quiet time when needed. These experiences have supported children's emotional awareness, self-regulation and social skills, helping them build positive relationships with peers.

The children showed great enthusiasm in learning about Chinese New Year and exploring Chinese culture. Educators provided a variety of hands-on experiences including storytelling, creating zodiac horse and firecracker crafts, and making a lion head using recycled materials. The children proudly performed a lion dance with their creation! They also learned to use chopsticks, explored Chinese calligraphy and enjoyed making dumplings together. These activities supported fine motor development, creativity and cultural understanding.

We were delighted to have some Chinese families join our celebration by dressing their children in traditional Chinese clothing and sharing delicious Chinese food with the centre. This strengthened our sense of community and provided authentic cultural experiences for all children.



## Upcoming Events

In March, we are looking forward to celebrating Harmony Week. On Monday, 17th March, we will be having a Harmony parade. We invite children to wear something orange or their cultural clothing on this day.

We also encourage families to send in a photo of a special cultural celebration from your family. These photos will be used as talking points to help children share and learn about each other's backgrounds.

We celebrate the joy of family traditions, kindness, and community. We look forward to celebrating together and recognising that everyone belongs 




## Family Involvement




