## Babies

During March, the babies enjoyed a range of meaningful and playful experiences that supported their understanding of similarities and differences. As they explored everyday objects such as soft and hard toys, big and small blocks, and familiar items in their environment, they began to notice patterns, differences, and connections.

It was wonderful to see their curiosity grow as these experiences supported their early cognitive development and emerging language skills.

Our focus on social and emotional development was enriched through shared group experiences, including the celebration of Harmony Day. Babies and educators came together to enjoy cultural dress ups and creative art activities, fostering a sense of belonging, inclusion, and respect for diversity.

We also explored the celebration of Eid through engaging sensory play and collage activities, creating opportunities for connection and supporting the development of warm, positive relationships.

## Toddlers

Our toddlers explored the season of autumn through a variety of play-based learning experiences that supported their overall development. Using natural materials such as leaves, sticks, and pinecones, the children engaged in sensory play that encouraged curiosity and discovery.

Language development was supported through songs, storytelling, and everyday conversations. Fine motor skills were strengthened through painting, drawing, and leaf collages, while gross motor skills developed through outdoor play, including jumping and leaf parachute.

We also celebrated Harmony Week through activities promoting diversity and inclusion. The children engaged in imaginative play, planting, and stories about kindness and cultures around the world. They began learning to say "hello" in different languages and explored music through instruments and rhythm.

Our multicultural dress-up day was a highlight, alongside a "Care for Country" song and creative arts expressing their understanding of Harmony Week.

## Kindy

March has been a wonderful and engaging month in our Kindy room. The children have shown great curiosity and enthusiasm as they explored a variety of topics based on their interests, including the zoo, transportation, and body parts. Through play based and hands on experiences, the children have been actively involved in meaningful learning across all areas of development.

### Zoo Exploration

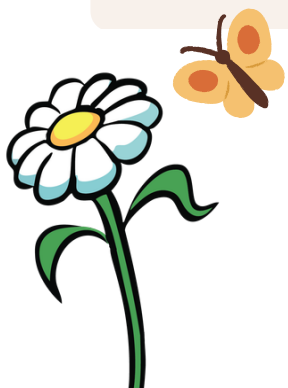
The children were very excited to learn about animals and their habitats. Through stories, discussions, and creative experiences, they explored different zoo animals, engaged in imaginative play, and shared their knowledge about their favourite animals. These experiences supported language development, creativity, and confidence in self expression.

### Transportation

Our transportation topic sparked lots of excitement as children explored how people and objects move from one place to another. They learned about different types of transport, including cars, buses, and rockets. The children particularly enjoyed exploring rockets, where they did counting down and created their own unique rocket crafts using shapes. This supported their understanding of early numeracy, shapes, and creativity, while also encouraging teamwork and problem solving skills.

### Body Parts and Five Senses

Towards the end of the month, the children explored body parts and the five senses. Using the familiar song "Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes," they confidently identified different parts of their bodies. They participated in a range of sensory experiences to explore sight, hearing, touch, taste, and smell. Highlights included playing musical instruments to explore sound and engaging in creative activities focused on building body awareness. These experiences supported children's self awareness, language development, and understanding of how their bodies work.

I love most about Daisy's is the warm and supportive environment. It's wonderful to see children grow in confidence, explore their interests, and build strong relationships with educators and friends every day.



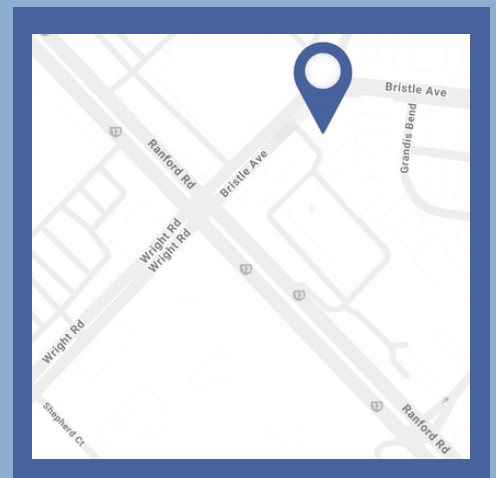
