Babies

In April, the babies explored colours through a variety of hands-on, sensory-rich activities that supported their early learning and development. Using a play-based approach, the environment was thoughtfully set up to encourage curiosity, exploration, and discovery.

Babies engaged in colour exploration through sensory play, including coloured water, soft fabric pieces, and safe paint experiences. They enjoyed mixing colours with their hands, helping to develop an early understanding of cause and effect.

We also introduced simple sorting activities using coloured objects, where babies began to notice similarities and differences. Songs, picture cards, and books were used to support language development.

On Earth Day, the babies planted plants in the garden, helping to foster their connection with the natural environment.



Toddlers

In April, toddlers had a joyful and engaging time exploring a variety of themes through play, stories, and hands-on learning experiences.

Our Easter celebrations were filled with excitement and creativity. Children enjoyed Easter arts and crafts, dress-ups, books, songs, and sensory play. We also held fun Easter hunts, encouraging teamwork, sharing, and exploration while supporting fine motor and imaginative skills.

Storytime continued to be a highlight, with favourites such as *We're Going on a Bear Hunt*, *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*, and *Where Is the Green Sheep?* Toddlers loved participating in these interactive stories by acting out movements, building creativity, language, sequencing, listening, and motor skills.

Through these experiences, children explored concepts like counting, days of the week, colours, and healthy eating. They also expressed their creativity through art and sensory activities, including creating their own colourful artwork inspired by the stories.

Kindy

In the Kindy room, the children have been actively engaged in exploring the exciting themes of five senses, colors, and celebrating Easter through a variety of fun and meaningful experiences.

Five Senses Exploration

The children participated in a range of hands-on sensory activities that supported their understanding of the five senses: sight, taste, smell, hearing, and touch. Through these experiences, children explored the world around them by observing, listening, tasting, smelling, and feeling different materials. These activities encouraged curiosity, language development, and a deeper awareness of their bodies and environment.

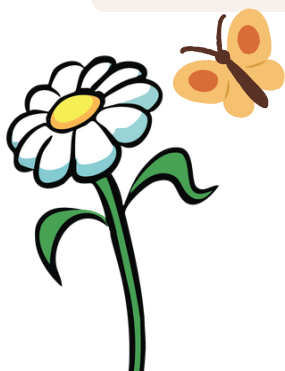
Colour

Important Health & Safety Updates

To help us keep our learning environment safe, happy, and healthy for all children, we've made a few updates to our medication procedures. We appreciate you taking a moment to read through the information below and supporting us with these important practices.

Illness & Medication Guidelines

To support the wellbeing of all children and staff, we kindly ask that:

- Children are kept at home for at least 24 hours after starting antibiotics, so we can be sure there are no unexpected side effects.
- Children are kept at home for 24 hours after their last dose of paracetamol, ensuring they are feeling well and ready to participate in the day.
- No medication is left in children's bags. Please hand any medication directly to a staff member so it can be safely stored and managed.

Use of Paracetamol at the Service

- If a child develops a fever of 38°C or higher while at the service, paracetamol may be given only if written permission has been provided.
- We will contact you straight away and ask that your child is collected within one hour.
- Only one dose of paracetamol will be given while your child is in our care.
- Before administering, our team will always check that your child has not had paracetamol (or similar medication) within the previous 4 hours.

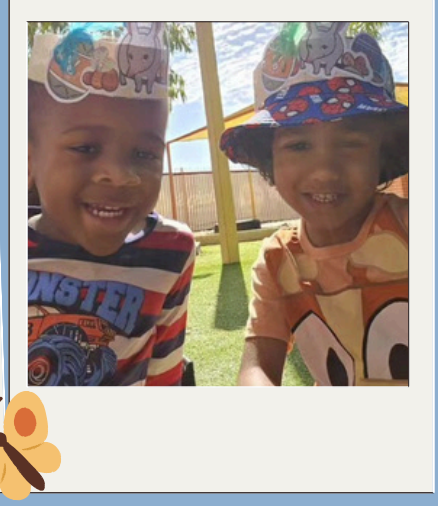

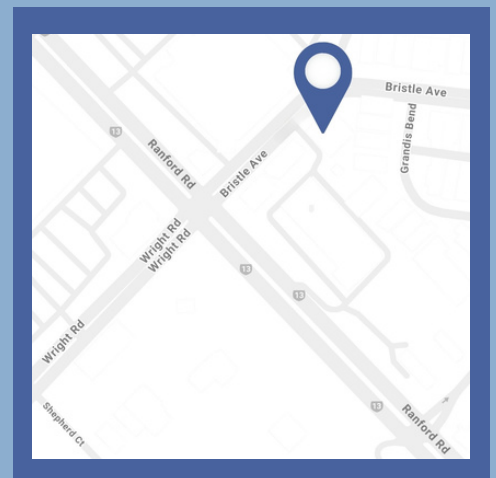
