Babies

During June, our babies explored a variety of sensory experiences with a focus on sea animals. They enjoyed finger painting, jelly play, sensory trays, songs, and stories that encouraged curiosity and exploration.

We were also excited to welcome two new friends to our room. Educators have been supporting them as they settle into their new environment and build relationships with their peers.

Daily mat sessions continued to support the babies' social and language development, while exploring colourful musical instruments encouraged sensory learning. When the weather allowed, the children also enjoyed outdoor play in the sunshine and sandpit.

It has been a wonderful month filled with sensory play, new friendships, and learning through play.

Toddlers

In June, our toddlers had a wonderful time exploring Rainy Days, Numbers, and Shapes through a range of fun, play-based learning experiences.

Rainy Day Fun

The children explored rainy weather through stories, songs, conversations, dramatic play, sensory experiences, and creative activities. They learned about rain, clouds, and rainy-day clothing while building their vocabulary and understanding of the natural world. They also enjoyed creating rainy-day artwork, making rain sticks from recycled materials, and exploring water play, which supported creativity, fine motor skills, and problem-solving.

Exploring Numbers and Shapes

Through games and hands-on activities, the children developed their early maths skills by practising counting, recognising numbers, and exploring shapes. Favourite experiences included our "Find the Number Chair" game, shape house collages, shape bowling, number peg matching, and searching for hidden numbers in the sensory sand tray.

We are so proud of the children's enthusiasm and confidence as they continue to learn through play. We look forward to another exciting month of learning and discovery together.

Kindy

What a wonderful and busy month we have had in the Kindy Room! Throughout June, the children enthusiastically explored our theme of Community Helpers, learning about the many important people who help us in our everyday lives.

Through hands-on experiences and dramatic play, the children explored a variety of community helper roles. They enjoyed dressing up as firefighters and rescuing Teddy from pretend fires, becoming police officers chasing robbers, building houses as construction workers using recycled boxes, and taking on the roles of posties, dentists, chefs, veterinarians, transport drivers, garbage collectors, and bakers.

These engaging experiences supported the children's cognitive development, language skills, social interactions, and imaginative thinking. They also learned about asking for help when needed, making healthy food choices, caring for their teeth, and sustainability through sorting rubbish into different bins.

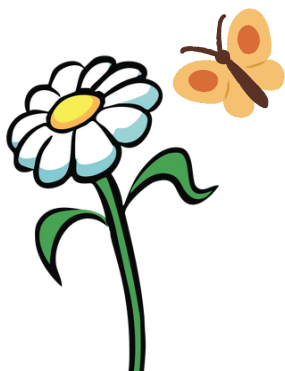
The children also participated in a range of community helper-themed craft activities that encouraged creativity while strengthening fine motor skills. Many activities also incorporated early numeracy concepts, including counting, sorting, matching, and recognising numbers.

National Reconciliation Week

This month, we proudly celebrated National Reconciliation Week by exploring the rich cultures and histories of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. Through meaningful experiences, the children learned about Aboriginal languages, artwork, traditions, and connections to Country. They worked together to create a reconciliation poster, enjoyed music and movement with clapsticks, and created artworks using natural materials.

The children also explored the Noongar season of Djeran, learning about the seasonal changes in nature. They listened to Dreaming stories, including the Rainbow Serpent, which sparked curiosity, discussion, and imaginative thinking.

We are incredibly proud of the children's enthusiasm, creativity, and willingness to learn throughout these experiences. Thank you to all our families for your continued support. We look forward to another exciting month of learning and discovery in July as we explore different types of weather and seasonal changes.
